Job seekers who view their job search as a learning process have more success finding their dream jobs than those who consider the task a challenge, according to a joint study by the university of Missouri and Lehigh Unive3rsity. “Attitudes mean a lot,” said David Turban, a professor of management at the University of Missouri’s Trulaske College of Business. “In our society, we found that job seekers who have a ‘learning goal orientation’ or a natural disposition t learn from every situation in life, tend to be more successful in achieving their career goals. We also found that the disposition is not just influenced by genetics; it can be acquired.”

No, you don’t Want to talk like Louis C.K., or Melissa McCarthy in “The Heat,” but properly used “clean” humor can lighten the tenseness of an interview and provide and interviewees with the opportunity to demonstrate their quick wit and creativity. To avoid an interview blowout interviewees should skip the canned jokes and focus on demonstrating their sense of humor by

- 1) laughing at jokes of others
- 2) building on jokes of others by adding their own witty commentary
- 3) and, if they do decide to initiate humor, and make it self depreciating to show the interviewer their true personality and their ability to not take themselves too seriously.

### **Advice to students who will be attending a Spring College Fair**

College Fairs can be crowded, thus, it is not easy to obtain a one on one meeting of substance at this type of meeting. Suggestion; Students design a brief profile and leave it at the table of the college one wishes to receive either information or a personal contact. The profile can be a card with the student’s name, address, telephone number, email address – the name of the high school the student is attending with a graduation date -- using one word descriptions of areas of interest -- that the student would like to meet personally with the college representative should that person be in the area. If the student can visit the college during the summer, this might be the time in which to request an interview during a summer visit. Should a parent accompany a student to a College Fair? Suggestion: The student and parent divide the table hopping task and each deliver profile cards. While delivering profile cards, pick up the college representative’s card for future reference. It is helpful to have a specific name (reference) when requesting information/interview.

### **Seniors: It's not too late to apply to college.**

March 15 is the application deadline for most colleges, with accepted students making their decisions and submitting their deposits by May 1. But did you know that there are hundreds of colleges and universities that accept applications and admit students until the start of the fall semester? These students are those who might have missed the standard application deadlines, were not accepted into their first- or second-choice colleges, or needed to raise their grades their last semester in high school to qualify for higher-level schools. Schools that accept applications after the typical stop date of March 15 are known as "Late Deadline" or "Late Application" schools. You will still need to meet application requirements (GPA, SAT/ACT scores, etc.), but there are many great opportunities at these

“Late Application” schools. One drawback: the later you apply, the harder it will be to land institution-awarded scholarships and financial aid

**Ways to discover “Late Deadline” schools.**

1. Ask the Admissions Office at a particular college
2. Checkout NACAC Space Availability Survey
3. Use the Common Application’s Search Tools
4. Peruse Peterson’s List of Late Deadline Schools
5. Use the College Board’s College Match Maker Tool
6. Don’t forget Public Universities and Community Colleges
